Supported Internships provide a structured study programme for 16 to 24 year olds with learning difficulties and/or disabilities (LDD) who have a statement of special educational needs, LDA or EHCP, who want to move into employment and need extra support to do so.

The programme has one primary aim which is to: Wherever possible support young people to move into paid employment with the employer at the end of the programme.

However, alongside this are the following aims:

Equip interns with the skills they need for work, through learning in the workplace Where interns do not move into paid work, ensure relevant agencies are able to continue job searching and employment support The programme will usually run for one year. However, this will be flexible depending on the intern's individual needs. We will work closely with the interns, their circle of support, and host employers to ensure optimal opportunity for successfully gaining paid employment. #### About the role

You will be carrying out a variety of roles including working with books, helping our customers, or other tasks as directed by the library manager. The role will provide useful experience of working in a customer-facing environment and will help you develop new skills and confidence.

What we need from you

We require our applicants to be keen and reliable and to be willing to play a key role in supporting staff in their work. Knowledge of libraries or a willingness to learn is also important, as is an interest in helping our customers.

We will ask for parental permission if you are under 16 or a reference if you are over 16 when you apply for the role. You will need to be at least 14 years old. Our 1:1 mentoring sessions are typically held weekly for ½ - 1 hour at a time, over a 6 week period.

We work with each young person to address any issues or concerns throughout the programme, individually tailoring sessions based on their specific needs. These are ascertained through conversations with the school, parent/guardian and the young person, including mild to high level emotional or behavioural difficulties, persistent non-school attendance, family problems or temporary exclusions.

Further examples of specific focuses of programmes may include:

- Acting as an early intervention strategy to support vulnerable young people at risk of or involved in crime and/or anti-social behaviour.

- Building a young person's confidence and selfesteem to empower them to protect themselves from sexual exploitation.

2. Young people must must be aged 11-18

3. Other factors that we would consider include:

- Complex family issues that affect school life, at risk behaviour e.g. sexual behaviour, bullying, substance misuse school refuser.

- Demonstrating anti-social behaviour in the community and in school

#### About the role

Bookclub volunteers play a crucial role in building children's confidence in not only reading but speaking and writing skills too. They provide sessions where the children can talk about the books they've read, do some book-related activities and learn to choose books for themselves and read for pleasure. This also develops a reading habit. This role is great for anyone who likes working with children, has some time to prepare the sessions and wants to make a difference!

What we need from you

Our Bookclub role requires someone who is enthusiastic and willing to commit time to both organising and delivering a session (usually once a month). Sessions normally last between an hour and an hour 30 mins. Each session will vary, but the simple format of sharing what the children have read, doing book related activities and choosing new books will be the same.

We will ask for a reference when you apply for the role, and you will need to be at least 18 years old.
