A supported internship is a college course and work placement where you will learn skills to help you get a job.







How does the internship work?





It starts in September and ends by July.



You will spend 3 days a week in your work placement.



A work placement is the place where you learn to do a job.

A work placement could be at a bakery, at a garden centre, in an office or at any work place.



You will spend 1 day at the college.



You will have 1 day off.



When it ends, Oxfordshire Employment will help you get a paid job.

To apply for a supported internship you need to:



Have a learning disability

Be 16 to 24 years old.



Go to a college that offers Oxfordshire Supported Internships.



Have applied for an Education and Health Care Plan. We can help you with this.


